ON THE OCCASION OF THE FIFTH INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE "HUMAN RIGHTS PROTECTION IN EURASIA: EXCHANGE OF BEST PRACTICES OF OMBUDSPERSONS"

This Conference, by ensuring an examination of human rights protection by a wide range of institutions, drawn from many countries, represents the very best way for us to advance our collective understanding, and collaborative work, to support human rights in Eurasia and globally.
